ride a bike	phr.	to sit on and control the movements of bike	My father taught me how to <b>ride a bike</b> .
scooter	n.	a child's vehicle that is made of a narrow board with two small wheels and an upright handle	Her favorite toy is a little red <b>scooter</b> .
trolley	n.	an electric vehicle that goes along metal tracks in the road	I liked the yellow <b>trolley</b> when I traveled Portugal.
train	n.	a railway engine connected to carriages for carrying people or carrying goods	Hurry up, or we'll miss the <b>train</b> .
on foot	phr.	walking	Are you going by bicycle or <b>on foot</b> ?

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plane	n.	a vehicle designed for air travel, with wings and one or more engines	We'll be boarding the <b>plane</b> in about 20 minutes.
ride	n.	a journey on a horse or bicycle, or in a vehicle	It's a short bus <b>ride</b> to the airport.
afraid	adj.	feeling fear, or feeling worry	The night view of the city was <b>amazing</b> .
amazing	adj.	extremely surprising	It's <b>amazing</b> that no one else has applied for the job!
cabin crew	n.	in an aircraft, the people whose job it is to take care of the passengers	For certain airlines, <b>cabin crew</b> need to pass their language examinations.
bounce	v.	to move up or away after hitting a surface	Her bag <b>bounced</b> against her side as she walked.
seat	n.	a place that is for someone to sit	It was exciting to sit in the window <b>seat</b> .
ride	v.	to travel in a vehicle, such as a car, bus, or train	I <b>ride</b> to work on my bike.

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costume	n.	the set of clothes typical of a particular country or for a particular activity	The children were dressed in traditional <b>costumes</b> .
festival	n.	a special time or event when people gather to celebrate something	The town has a summer <b>festival</b> in the park.
parade	n.	a large number of people walking or in vehicles, usually for a public celebration	A <b>parade</b> set an upbeat mood for the official opening.
celebrate	v.	to honor enjoyable activities in order to show that something is important	We always <b>celebrate</b> our wedding anniversary by going out to dinner.
competition	n.	a situation in which someone is trying to win something	There's a lot of <b>competition</b> between computer companies.
fireworks	n.	the pattern of colorful explosion in the air planned as a show	What time do the New Year's <b>fireworks</b> start?
take place	phr.	to happen	The concert <b>takes place</b> next Thursday.
lantern	n.	a light enclosed in a container	He found the <b>lantern</b> on the ground and flew it.

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decorate	v.	to add something in order to make it more attractive	They <b>decorated</b> the wedding car with ribbons and flowers.
tidy up	phr.	to make (something) clean and organized	Why don't you <b>tidy up</b> that dirty room?
symbol	n.	a sign, shape, or object that is used to represent something else	A heart shape is the <b>symbol</b> of love.
hide a coin	phr.	to put coin in a place where it cannot be seen or found	Where would you <b>hide a coin</b> in your room?
holiday	n.	a special day of celebration	The bank is closed tomorrow because it's a <b>holiday</b> .
gather	v.	to collect several things, often from different places or people	She <b>gathered</b> the children and hurried into the house.
have good luck	phr.	to be lucky	If you catch the falling petal or leaf, you will <b>have good luck</b> .
traditional	adj.	following the ways that have been established for a long time	In some countries, it is <b>traditional</b> for a bride to wear white.

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striped	adj.	something that has stripes on it	Do you prefer plain or <b>striped</b> shirts?
beside	prep.	at the side of, next to	Come and sit here <b>beside</b> me.
on the bed	phr.	in a position above bed	She bounced up and down excitedly <b>on the bed</b> .
cozy	adj.	a small, comfortable, and warm	I felt <b>cozy</b> watching the fire.
on the right side	phr.	on the side of your body that is to east	<b>On the right side</b> , you can see the closet and a picture frame.
messy	adj.	dirty, unpleasant, or lacking order	I hate a <b>messy</b> kitchen.
under the window	phr.	under a thing filled with glass in the wall	I heard her singing <b>under the window</b> .
bright	adj.	strong in color	Matthew always wears <b>bright</b> colors.

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in the Arctic	phr.	at the very cold area around the North Pole	Whales are still being hunted and killed <b>in the Arctic</b> .
straw	n.	the dry stems of wheat and other grain plants	A <b>straw</b> shows which way the wind blows.
on the water	phr.	on the river or on the sea	The leaves floated <b>on the water</b> .
brick	n.	a rectangular block of hard material used for building walls and houses	The house has a small backyard, surrounded by a <b>brick</b> wall.
in hot countries	phr.	in the countries which have a high temperature	You can see this type of plants <b>in hot countries</b> .
in a forest	phr.	in the area covered with trees and plants	He got lost <b>in a forest</b> .
igloo	n.	a house made of blocks of snow or ice in the form of a dome	You might think it is cold in an <b>igloo</b> , but it isn't.
wood	n.	the substance that forms the inside part of the braches and trunk of a tree	He gathered some <b>wood</b> to build a fire.

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seasonal	adj.	relating to or happening during a particular period in the year	Animals have to find ways of coping with <b>seasonal</b> changes.
goalpost	n.	one of two posts that form part of the goal in various games	The ball hit the <b>goalpost</b> and bounced out.
ice hockey	n.	a game played on an ice rink in which players on skates use sticks to shoot a puck into the goal	He is a famous <b>ice hockey</b> player.
snowboarding	n.	the activity or sport of moving over snow using a snowboard	<b>Snowboarding</b> is my favorite sport in winter.
stick	n.	a long, thin piece of wood used in playing various sports	The kids poked holes in the ice with <b>sticks</b> .
on an ice rink	phr.	on a level of ice which is kept frozen to skate on	This set has been specially installed <b>on an ice rink</b> .
on a grass field	phr.	on an area covered with grass which is used for playing sports	We'll be running <b>on a grass field</b> .
goggles	n.	special glasses to protect the eyes from chemicals, wind, water, etc.	The safety <b>goggles</b> are often made with lightweight material.

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competitive	adj.	eager to do better than others in an activity, esp. trying to win in a sports activity	She's <b>competitive</b> and gets very upset if she loses at anything.
win a race	phr.	to achieve first position or the fastest in a competition	Together, they will try to <b>win a race</b> .
work together	phr.	to cooperate	He refused to <b>work together</b> with my team.
outdoor	adj.	existing, happening, or done outside	A number of <b>outdoor</b> concerts will be held during the summer.
personal	adj.	relating to a single or particular person	Do you mind if I ask you a <b>personal</b> question?
hobby	n.	an activity that someone does for pleasure when they are not working	He has many <b>hobbies</b> , including photography and gardening.
for fun	phr.	for pleasure	I decided to learn Spanish, just <b>for fun</b> .
